Make your own... Printing Press

You will need:

- Polystyrene/foam board
- Tracing paper or parchment paper
- Pencil and/or felt pen

- Scissors
- PaperPaint

Paint brush

• Tape

Instructions

- 1. Cut your foam board to your desired shape and size.
- 2. Write, or draw, your design on to your piece of tracing paper. First do it in pencil, then trace over it again with a felt pen.
- 3. Tape the tracing paper onto your foam board—make sure it's the wrong side up!
- 4. Use a pen or pencil to trace over the design, pressing down in order to push the design into the foam board.
- 5. Remove the tracing paper, and if needed, trace over the design again on the foam board to etch it in deeper.
- 6. Paint over the design on the foam board.
- 7. Before the paint dries, stamp it down onto a piece of paper to transfer the design.
- 8. Wipe the paint off the foam board before it dries to use it again.

Did you know?

- The printing press was invented in Europe around 1440, and came to England in 1476.
- Prior to the British Civil Wars, King Charles I and his government had very strict control over what could be printed.
- When Charles I lost power and the civil war began in the 1640s, government control over the printing industry ended. As a result, the industry exploded as people began printing as much as possible to make money—often prioritising a good story over the truth.
- In 1642 alone, more printed material was published in England than there had been in the past 165 years in total!
